

Anthony Gilholy

Born: c.1763
President: 1817-1818
Died: 1821

Anthony Gilholy's name appears in the entrance book of Trinity College on 12 June 1781 when he was then just 18 years of age. His father, Andrew, was a farmer, and their home was in Tipperary. Anthony is noted as being a scholar at Trinity College in 1784 and was awarded the following degrees: BA in 1786 and MB in 1789.

Gilholy was admitted as a Licentiate of the College of Physicians on 19 January 1795 and a Fellow on St. Luke's Day, 18 October 1798. The same day he was elected a Fellow, Gilholy was also appointed as Registrar of the College. He was elected President of the College on St Luke's Day in 1817.

Little information has survived on Gilholy's professional career. The 1815 *Gentleman's and Citizen's Almanack* record him as resident in Bray, County Wicklow. He is also recorded as being a practitioner in midwifery while President of the College.

Anthony Gilholy married Mary Wilson in 1787. He died in 1821 at Sea Point House, Blackrock, County Dublin.
